

## With Whom Do You Stand? Exodus 2:1-22

Main Idea: Moses chose to identify with God's people and God rather than enjoy the pleasures of Egypt.

I. Moses is adopted into the household of Pharaoh (Exodus 2:1-10)

<sup>22</sup> "Moses was educated in all the learning of the Egyptians, and he was a man of power in words and deeds. Acts 7:22 (NASB)

II. Moses chooses to identify with God's people and God rather than enjoy the pleasures of Egypt (Exodus 2:11-15; Acts 7:22-29; Hebrews 11:23-26)

Acts 7:23-28

<sup>24</sup> By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, <sup>25</sup> choosing rather to endure ill-treatment with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, <sup>26</sup> considering the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures of Egypt; for he was looking to the reward. Hebrews 11:24-26 (NASB)

III. Moses begins a new life (Exodus 2:16-22)
